

FELLOWSHIP FINAL WRITTEN EXAMINATION

Infertility-Andrology

Examination Format:

The final written fellowship and diplomas examination shall consist of one paper with 80-120 Single Best Answer MCQs. Up to 10% unscored items can be added for pretesting purposes.

Passing Score:

The passing score is 70%. However, if the percentage of candidates passing the examination before final approval is less than 70%, the passing score must be lowered by one mark at a time aiming at achieving 70% passing rate or 65% passing score whichever comes first. Under no circumstances can the passing score be reduced below 65%.

Question 1

A 31-year-old man following up in the clinic after passing his second small left ureteric stone which was sent for analysis and found to be composed of calcium oxalate and stone former work up reveals no hypercalcemia and no urinary tract infection and no bowel disease and normocalciuria.

What is the next step for this patient?
