## **NEUROSURGERY SKULL BASE**

#### Final Written Examination

#### **Examination Format:**

The Saudi subspecialty fellowship and diplomas final written examination shall consist of one paper with 80-120 multiple-choice questions (singlebest answer out of four options). 10% unscored items can be added forpretesting purposes.

## Passing Score:

The passing score is 70%. If the percentage of candidates passing the examination before final approval is less than 70%, the passing score must be lowered by one mark at a time aiming at achieving 70% passing rate or 65% passing score whichever comes first. Under nocircumstances can the passing score be reduced below 65%.
